RE: ROAD CLOSURE – Red Lion -Five Points Road and Bunnell Hill Road Intersection to be closed for one (1) week as part of Lytle-Five Points Road and Bunnell Hill Road Roundabout Project

Lebanon, Ohio – Clearcreek Township, Warren County, Ohio – Red Lion - Five Points Road and Bunnell Hill Road Intersection will be closed to traffic from all directions beginning Monday, June 28, 2021 for one (1) week, weather permitting. The road closure is for the construction of the Sanitary Sewer as part of the Lytle-Five Points Road and Bunnell Hill Road Roundabout Project.

The detour will utilize the Roundabout Project detour, which is SR73 to SR48 to Social Row Road (Montgomery County) for the Bunnell Hill Road Closure. Residents on Red Lion – Five Points Road between Crossley Road and Bunnell Hill Road will have access to and from their homes via Crossley Road only.

About the Warren County Engineer

County Engineers in Ohio are required by law to be registered as both Professional Engineers (P.E.) and Professional Surveyors (P.S.) They are responsible for the maintenance and construction of county roads and maintenance and construction of bridges on county roads, township roads, and certain streets within municipalities. They are also responsible for maintaining land surveying records, checking the accuracy and adequacy of recorded land transfer documents, and establishing or re-establishing certain land survey monuments.
