RE: Shaker Run Boulevard to be closed for three (3) days for pavement repair work

Lebanon, Ohio – Turtlecreek Township, Warren County, Ohio – Shaker Run Boulevard will be closed to traffic for three (3) days between Greentree Road and Golf Club Drive beginning Monday, November 22, 2021, through Wednesday, November 24, 2021, weather permitting. The closure is for pavement repair work being completed by Turtlecreek Township and our office. The pavement repair work will occur between address 1463 and Ironwood Drive and also between address 1349 and Golf Club Drive. No detour will be posted. Traffic accessing the Shaker Run subdivision will need to use Shaker Golf Drive, unless you reside on or off of Shaker Run Blvd north of the repair areas.

Pavement repair work will also occur on Golf Club Drive in front of the golf club during this time frame. Golf Club Drive will remain open to traffic at all times; however, expect delays, as traffic will be maintained with flaggers in one lane around the part width construction.

About the Warren County Engineer

County Engineers in Ohio are required by law to be registered as both Professional Engineers (P.E.) and Professional Surveyors (P.S.) They are responsible for the maintenance and construction of county roads and maintenance and construction of bridges on county roads, township roads, and certain streets within municipalities. They are also responsible for maintaining land surveying records, checking the accuracy and adequacy of recorded land transfer documents, and establishing or re-establishing certain land survey monuments.
